Legislative Changes

There are several items that the Department of Health is dealing with currently that are important to orthodontists



The AAO submitted a complaint to the board about the illegal practice of dentistry by DTC corporations in 2017. The board turned it back to the Department of Health which has now sent it back to the Dental Quality Assurance Commission again under the dentist that is assigned to the case. Here is the explanation from the program manager,

"In order to take action against an unlicensed person/entity or a dentist, the department and the Dental Quality Assurance Commission (commission) must prove misconduct by clear and convincing evidence. This is a higher standard of proof than civil litigation and requires more and stronger evidence in order to successfully prosecute a case. The department's or commission's decision not to proceed on a case is most often not an endorsement of the action, but a recognition that the department or commission would not be able to prove by clear and convincing evidence that a violation occurred.

The commission currently has several cases pending related to unlicensed care providers. The investigation and disciplinary process can be delayed for a variety of reasons; complexity of the case, communicating through attorneys, additional investigations, obtaining expert witnesses, and multiple cases under consideration. The commission is carefully reviewing these cases to determine whether violations of Washington state law have occurred.

The department and the commission must comply with chapter 18.130 RCW, Uniform Disciplinary Act. This law requires all regulatory boards and commissions to follow the same process when considering discipline of a health care professionals.

I recognize that you may not be pleased about the lack of regulatory action on the AAO's complaint related to dental practice by unlicensed individuals. However, you can be assured that the case was carefully reviewed the Department of Healthoperated within the bounds of its authority and responsibility. You may request a copy of the case file through our Public Disclosure Records Center office at PDRC@doh.wa.gov."

As you may have also been privy to through your ADA membership, the ADA has filed a petition with US food and Drug administration.

Please know that dentists and the public can use the FDA's MedWatch voluntary reporting form to inform the FDA about problems patients encounter with direct to consumer products, such as aligners, partial dentures and snoring appliances. More general information about the FDA medical device reporting program can be found on the FDA's website.

If you are asked about the issue of "DIY dentistry," the ADA offers these talking points that you can share with your patients:

- The American Dental Association and member dentists across the country are dedicated to the health and safety of the patients they serve.
- ADA policies oppose Do-It-Yourself Teeth Straightening and Direct to Consumer Dental Laboratory Services because dentists are concerned about the potential for irreversible harm to patients.
- For example, orthodontic treatment, if not done correctly, could lead to potential bone loss and receding gums, changed bites, and other issues.
- The ADA believes that for the health and well-being of the public, patient supervision by a licensed dentist is necessary for all phases of treatment.
